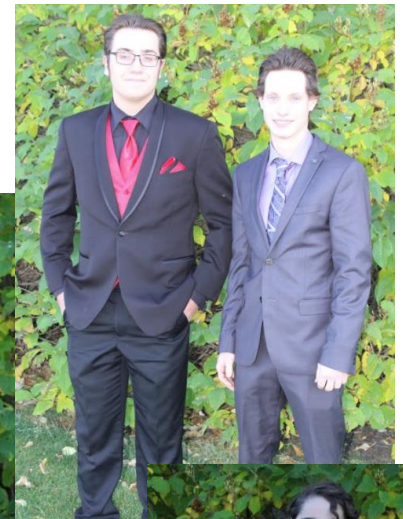

- **LEGION DEDICATION AWARD** – Awarded to a student who demonstrates leadership within the school and dedication to their studies.
- **JOHN C. PERRY MEMORIAL GRADE 11 4-H** – Awarded to a 4-H Club member in Grade 11 who has the highest marks in 3 academic & one non-academic course.
- **CREDIT ACHIEVEMENT AWARD** – For each credit over 110 that a student achieves at the Delburne Centralized School an award up to \$25 is given. The purpose is to encourage students to explore many options to broaden their knowledge, and also to bring more money into the school budget to benefit all students. Credits are based on a maximum of 145 credits. All eligible credits must be earned at Delburne Centralized School.
- **MLA CITIZENSHIP AWARD** - Outstanding characteristics in areas of academic ability, leadership, volunteering & a willingness to put the good of others above personal ambitions.
- **CONSTABLE BROCK MYROL MEMORIAL** – Awarded to a grade 12 student who has demonstrated leadership and service within the school and/or community. Preference given to a student going on to pursue a career in service – i.e. RCMP, firefighting, EMT, and other careers that have the same sense of service.
- **DELBURNE ELKS TRADES/AGRICULTURE SCHOLARSHIP** – Awarded to a Gr 12 student who has been enrolled in either a Registered Apprenticeship Program or School Within a College Trades Program or is enrolled in an Agricultural Program at an accredited institution. The student must show commitment to the program and a willingness to learn. They must also have an interest in pursuing the trades or agriculture as a future career.
- **GOVERNOR GENERAL’S MEDAL** – Awarded in each Canadian High School to a student who achieves the highest academic average over 80%.
- **RUTHERFORD SCHOLARSHIP** – Awarded to a student having a minimum combined average based on **five designated courses** in at least one grade: Grade 10, 11 or 12 as calculated from marks on a valid Alberta Transcript of High School Achievement. Option/CTS courses may also be considered. If you meet the required overall average for any of the above grades, the amount of the scholarship will be calculated accordingly.
- **TREY PURDIE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP** - Awarded to a student who will be furthering their education following their graduation from High School.

COVID-19 ALBERTA HEALTH DAILY CHECKLIST

Overview

This tool has been developed to support schools, activity organizers, employers, businesses and facility operators in reducing the risk of transmission of COVID-19 among attendees/staff. The tool is meant to be used to assist with assessing attendees who may be symptomatic, or who may have been exposed to someone who is ill or has confirmed COVID-19.

Attendees should complete this checklist prior to participating in the activity or program. Children and youth may need a parent to assist them to complete this screening tool.

If an individual answers **YES** to any of the questions, they **must not** be allowed to attend or participate in the activity or program. *Individuals with fever, cough, shortness of breath, runny nose, or sore throat, are required to isolate for 10 days per [CMOH Order 05-2020](#) unless they receive a negative COVID-19 test and are feeling better. Use the [AHS Online Assessment Tool](#) to determine if testing is recommended and follow information on [isolation requirements](#).

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues to evolve, this screening tool will be updated as required.

² Face-to-face contact within 2 metres. A health care worker in an occupational setting wearing recommended personal protective equipment is not considered to be a close contact.

HOW LONG TO STAY HOME FROM SCHOOL

A student who is required to isolate due to symptoms may return to school—**before 10 days**—if they test negative for COVID-19 and no longer have symptoms, as long as they have not been identified as a close contact of a case of COVID-19. For more details: [Isolation requirements](#)

If a student has these symptoms

What to do

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Runny nose
- Sore throat

- Isolate at home for a minimum of 10 days from when symptoms started or until symptoms resolve, whichever is longer.
- COVID-19 test recommended.
- Can return to school before 10 days only if a COVID-19 test is negative, symptoms are gone, and the student is not a close contact of someone with COVID-19.
- If test results are positive, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow instructions received from Alberta Health Services.

- Chills
- Painful swallowing
- Stuffy nose
- Headache
- Muscle or joint aches
- Feeling unwell, fatigue or severe exhaustion
- Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or unexplained loss of appetite
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Pink eye (conjunctivitis)

- Stay home from school until symptoms go away—**not** required to isolate for 10 days.
- COVID-19 test recommended.
- If test results are positive, isolate at home for at least 10 days and follow instructions received from Alberta Health Services.
