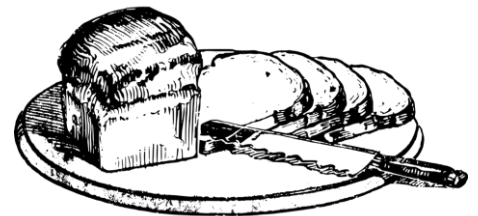

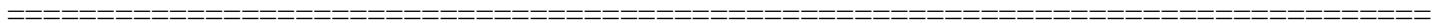
HOT LUNCH AND HOT DOG VOLUNTEERS NEEDED
