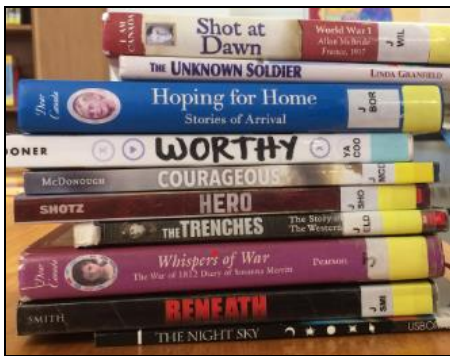

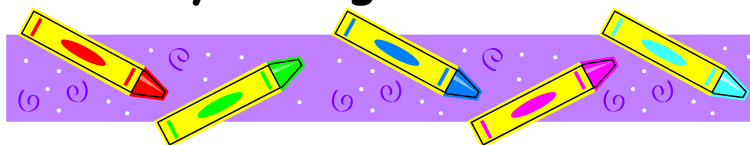
Welcome to Kindergarten Meeting for Parents and New Kindergarten Students
